IMPORANT INFORMATION

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

Flu vaccinations are mandatory for all registered horses and ponies, and they must be in possession of a valid flu vaccination certificate. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the horse's vaccinations are up to date and correctly recorded on the diagrammatic vaccination record. Spot checks will be regularly carried out at shows. The horse/pony must have received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. Only these two injections need to have been given before a horse/pony can compete in competitions. In addition, a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than one year apart. Horses/Ponies must have received the full course of vaccinations or the booster at least 7 days prior to the competition date, and not more than 1 year after the previous booster.

CLOSING DATES FOR ENTRIES

Entries will be accepted ONLINE only via www.grandstandentries.com. Early Entries will close on 19th August 2024. Late Entries will be accepted at an increased rate until the 27th August 2024.

PLEASE NOTE: That whilst every effort has been made to allow exhibitors to enter as many classes as possible, classes will not be held up in the event of a clash so exhibitors must be aware of this when choosing which classes to enter.

Competitors who have competed at Horse of the Year Show or Stoneleigh Horse Show in the last five years or have entered a Horse of the Year Show Showing qualifier in the last five years, will already have an account on the Grandstand Online Entry System.

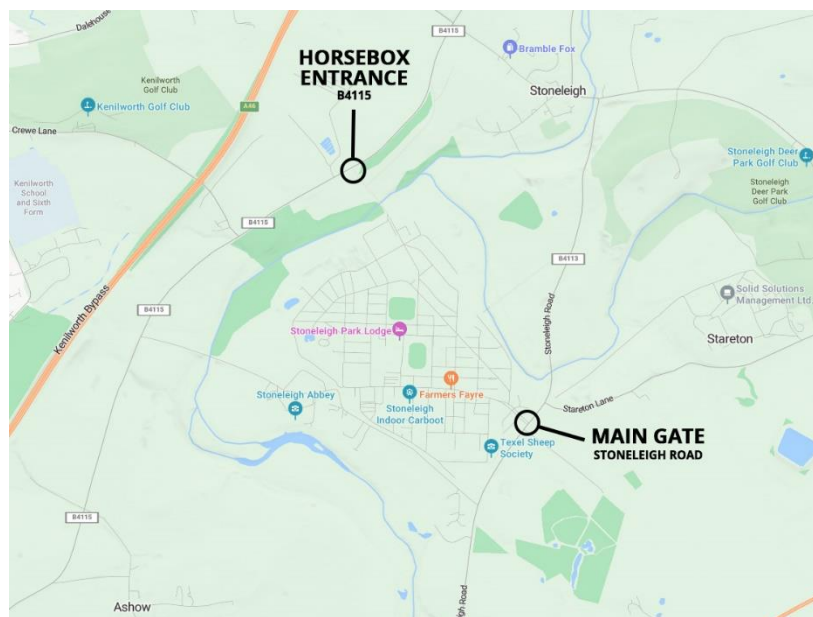
The gates to enter the show will only be open during the following times:

SHOW ADMISSION

Admission to Stoneleigh Horse Show is free of charge. Authorised car parking will be available on site at Stoneleigh Park, attendees must have arranged this with us prior to arrival. Entrance via the Main gate, please follow signage to designated parking area.

PARKING

No vehicles, including but not limited to, caravans or mobile homes will be admitted to the showground or tents sited on the showground without a valid pass. Cars towing caravans will not be permitted to park with horseboxes.

MARK SHEETS

If applicable, showing mark sheets will be posted on the Stoneleigh Horse Show website. Please note, these are only available for certain classes. Copies will be available to download from the website www.stoneleighhorseshow.co.uk within one month of the show ending.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every exhibitor, competitor, owner, rider, handler, driver and/or producer (hereinafter known as "Competitor") at Stoneleigh Horse Show must make themselves conversant with these General Rules and Regulations, in addition to the Special Conditions applicable to the various Classes and Competitions. Competitors may only compete on the understanding that they comply with and are bound by these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions relating to each Class or Competition.

1. ONSITE STABLING

STABLES ARE BOOKED FROM 17.00 ON THE DAY OF ARRIVAL UNTIL 16:00 ON THE DAY OF DEPARTURE

A deposit of £20 per stable is required, payable by cash to the Stable Managers on arrival. This will be refunded on departure following inspection by the Stable Managers to ensure the stable has been left mucked out, clean, tidy, with beds banked up and in good repair.

Horses and ponies must be removed from their stables by 16.00 on the day of departure, which must be strictly adhered to. Grandstand Media Ltd. reserves the right to charge the daily rate for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by Grandstand Media Ltd. to any person failing to remove their horse/pony from any stable by the designated time, it further reserves the right to deduct such charge from any prize money due and entries may be refused for future shows.

Vacated stables must be left in the state they are found. Any stables left in an unsatisfactory condition will incur a charge. No permanent stables are available.

Stabling is available subject to capacity. Applications must be made online, and fees paid in full. **The final date for application is the entries closing date.** Stables are sold on a first come, first served basis.

If stallion stables are required, please indicate in the Stallion Box section on your application.

1.1 Bedding

Bedding will not be provided. Bedding is available to purchase and should be purchased prior to the show with your entries. No hard feed will be available to purchase onsite.

1.2 Cancellation/Changes of Stabling

There will be NO REFUNDS for stabling and no changes/transfers of any booked stables.

2. LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES

Bookings are subject to availability ONLY. Overnight passes for horseboxes will be collected on site at the show upon arrival. Daily horseboxes will **not** require a pass.

3. ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW

On arrival at the show, if applicable only - competitors should report to the Stable Manager's Office where their stable booking will be confirmed.

Please note that competitors with horses and/or ponies arriving at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will not be admitted between the hours of **20:00 and 06:00**

Due to FIRE REGULATIONS and the licence issued by Warwick District Council, the following will be strictly enforced:

- a. All lived-in horseboxes will be sited by Grandstand Media Ltd. personnel at the required distance and should not be moved before leaving the showground.
- b. All competitors/grooms living in horseboxes must ensure that they know the location of the nearest fire point and fire-fighting equipment.
- c. All vehicles must be equipped with a fire extinguisher.
- d. Cars which are not towing a horse trailer, caravans and motor homes are not permitted in the Horsebox Park.

4. LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES WITH PORTALOOS

Occupants of lived-in horseboxes with their own toilet facilities may not empty them on the showground. Anyone found to be emptying Portaloos or similar at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will be removed from site and liable to any charges imposed by the organisers. There are a number of permanent toilet blocks around the site.

5. PAYMENTS AND VAT

Payments for entry fees can be made online only.

VAT is applicable to stabling, vehicle parking, and bedding, and has been included in the quoted prices at 20%.

6. STABLE AREAS AND HORSEBOX PARK

6.1 Personal Belongings

Please note, any items left within the stabling area and horsebox park are left at the owners own risk. Grandstand Media Ltd. will not be held responsible for any items left unattended.

6.2 Unauthorised use of stables

Any competitor or his/her representative who enters or makes use of any stable that has not been officially reserved for his/her use will be liable for the daily charge for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by Grandstand Media Ltd. We reserve the right to deduct any charges from any prize money due and entries may be refused for future shows.

6.3 Smoking and Fire Risks

- No smoking will be permitted in or near the stable area.
- No straw will be allowed on the showground, this includes straw in horseboxes and trailers.
- No hay may be stored under or near to any vehicle in the Horsebox Park at any time, but may be stored inside the horsebox.
- Additional containers containing flammable liquids/gases are not permitted to be stored outside of lorries or caravans.
- The use or possession of barbeques of any type will not be permitted at any time in the Horsebox Park or elsewhere on the showground.

IF FOUND, ANY OF THE ABOVE-MENTIONED ARTICLES WILL BE CONFISCATED AND REMOVED BY THE STABLE TEAM.

6.4 Electrical Hook-Up

Optional electrical hook-up is available to be purchased at the time of making an entry. No vehicle will be connected to the power supply that does not display a valid pass. There is no charge to park any horseboxes that are not connected to the electrical hook-up.

6.5 Motorised Vehicles

The use of electrical buggies, motorcycles, motorised scooters and other internal combustion machines is **FORBIDDEN** on the showground. Authorised vehicles ONLY.

Please note: Disability scooters are permitted for those who require them.

6.6 Bicycles & Scooters

The use of bicycles, scooters and similar items are not permitted in the exercise or competition areas. Bicycles and scooters ridden anywhere else on the showground are permitted but must be ridden sensibly. Failure to adhere to this may result in removal of the item by the organisers.

6.7 Dogs

All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. No dogs are permitted in the competition and exercise areas of the showground, with the exception of assistance dogs. Please ensure you clean up after your dog. The organisers reserve the right to impose a £100 fine to anyone who is seen to not clean up after their dog.

Orders can be placed online or at the trade stand during the show.

8. ENTRIES

Competitors must be bona fide owners (or such persons nominated by the owner to be their authorised agent to make the entry on the owner's behalf) at the closing date of entry of the horses/ponies which they are entering.

The person who made the original entry will be considered the owner (or their authorised representative) and he/she alone will be recognised as being entitled to any cups or prize money which may be won by the entries made by him/her. Entries must be made via the official Online Entry System at www.grandstandentries.com and must be duly completed and authorised by the Competitor or their authorised agent.

9. ENTRY FEES

No entry will be accepted without the appropriate fees.

10. SUBSTITUTIONS

No alterations or substitutions of any entry will be allowed after the closing date of entries without permission of the Show Secretary. Entries must therefore be made in the appropriate competition(s) or class(es) for which animals are eligible.

11. AGE AND HEIGHT

In any height restricted classes competitors must ensure they fulfil any requirements for a valid Joint Measurement Board Annual or Full Height Certificate as per individual class guidelines.

The age and height of each horse/pony entered and any other specific particulars must be accurately stated at time of entry if required by the conditions of the competition. A false declaration or mis-statement of any kind, including change of name of a horse/pony, incorrect description or false declaration of prizes won at horse shows, may at the discretion of the Organisers; disqualify a competitor from the Show and the horse/pony entered from any prize and from entering or being entered again at the Show.

In particular, a mis-statement as to the height will automatically render the animal ineligible for any judging or prizes. Competitors must be prepared to verify any statement made in a manner required by the Organisers. All entries must be made in the name of the horse/pony under which it is registered with the relevant association/society and must correspond with the name shown on the Annual or Full JMB Certificate and National Passport at all times.

12. DECLINING ENTRIES

The Organisers may at their absolute discretion, decline any entry, exclude or remove any person or animal from the Show or future Shows or return any entry fee without being required to assign any reason or being liable for any compensation.

13. FORFEITURE OF FEES AND CHARGES

Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and charges for stabling, passes and horsebox parking if appropriate. **No refund will be made in any circumstances.**

14. CANCELLATION

Grandstand Media Limited are entitled to cancel Stoneleigh Horse Show, upon the serving of notice to the entrant of such cancellation, not less than 48 hours prior to the event; OR an event of Forces Majeure. For the purpose of this cancellation clause "Force Majeure" means an act of God including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster, act of any sovereign including but not limited to war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not) civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority or imposition of government sanction embargo or similar action; law, judgement, order, decree, embargo, blockade, labour dispute including but not limited to strike, lockout or boycott; interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric power, gas, water or telephone service; failure of the transportation of any personnel equipment, machinery supply or material required by Grandstand Media Ltd for the provision of show services breach of contract by any essential personnel; any other matter or cause beyond the control of Grandstand Media Ltd.

All entries shall stand for any postponed Show unless withdrawn by written notice to the Show Secretary within one week of notification or public announcement in the press of such postponement. The postponement or abandonment of the Show, either before the opening or at any time during the course of the Show, shall not give rise to any claim whatsoever against the Show or the Organisers by the competitors or others except for refund of prepaid entries in respect of classes or competitions not held. In the case of postponement a refund will only be made in respect of entries duly withdrawn. Should any competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, entry fees will be refunded. It is regretted that stabling and other charges cannot be refunded.

Any competition for which there are not at least four entries under the ownership of different competitors may be cancelled. Competitors in the cancelled competition will be notified and may, at their option up to the close of entries, transfer the entries originally made to other competitions for which the animals originally entered may be eligible.

15. PROGRAMME AND CONDITIONS

The Organisers reserve to themselves the right to alter the timings, cancel, add to or amend any of the competitions, as necessities of the programme may require, increasing or reducing the number of Sections, and amend the Prize Money in such cases.

16. JUDGING

In all competitions, the Judges will select such animals in each class as they consider eligible for prizes of commendation. When they deem a veterinary examination necessary, such examination will be made before the prizes are awarded. This veterinary examination will be conducted by the show Veterinary Surgeons whose decisions shall be final and the result of such examination will be considered as confidential. No second opinion may be given. The Veterinary Surgeons may approach a Judge to enable consultation over an animal's soundness.

Further, the Judges shall have power at their discretion to withhold any prize for want of merit or any cause.

17. NO ADMISSION TO THE SHOW ARENA(S)

No person shall enter the Show Arena(s), which includes any space enclosed or set apart for judging or hold any communication with any Judge or examining Veterinary Surgeon without the signed permission of the Organisers or one of the Show Officials.

18. EXERCISE

No horse or pony will be allowed into the Competition Arenas to exercise at any time.

Any horse or pony found to be using an arena outside of a class time may be eliminated from competing.

No horse or pony will be allowed into the external Exercise Areas, except at such times as are announced or posted, or as stated in the timetable.

If the exercise arena is closed, then under no circumstances is anyone on the showground permitted to use any arena for exercise. Grandstand Media Ltd. will accept no liability for any accident or injury for any party failing to adhere to the rules as set out in this schedule.

The External Exercise Areas will only be open during the following times:

Friday 30 th August	17:00 – 20:00
Saturday 31 st August	06:30 – 20:00
Sunday 1 st September	06:30 – 18:00

19. COLLECTING RING

The Stewards in charge of the Collecting Ring will have sole control of the entrance and exits to the Arena/Ring. All competitors must present their horses and ponies at the Collecting Ring prior to admission to the Arena/Ring. Class timings are subject to change, all exhibitors must make themselves aware of the running of the arena and be ready to enter as required. Horses/ponies arriving late will not be permitted to enter the Arena/Ring, this rule will be strictly enforced. Collecting rings must not be used for exercise once competition has finished each day.

20. DRESS

Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse for any reason unless service uniform is being worn.

Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current approved BSI or European Safety Standards MUST be worn by riders 18 years and under, riders competing in Intermediate, Mountain and Moorland classes and by riders in any jumping class. Hats maybe subject to spot checks.

Where grooms or attendants are permitted to enter the arena during preliminary or final judging they must be correctly and smartly dressed. Body protectors are recommended whilst competing in all Working Hunter, M&M Working Hunter Pony and Working Hunter Pony classes, including in the practice ring.

21. NUMBERS

No substitution will be permitted unless the Duty Veterinary Surgeon certifies that the declared horse has become unfit to compete since the time of declaration. Back numbers will be issued and must be worn during competitions. Early Entries will be posted numbers, all other entries will collect from the Equestrian/Stable Managers Office.

22. DECORATIONS

No animal may, except in Championships, be decorated with any prize rosettes until after it has been judged. Rosettes will not be duplicated if lost or mislaid except at the expense of the competitor, and should, therefore, be carefully preserved.

23. VETERINARY SURGEONS, DOCTORS, AND FARRIER

The services of a Veterinary Surgeon, Medical Personnel and Farriers will be available on the showground or on call as necessary. All costs will be the responsibility of the rider/driver/owner/handler/exhibitor/producer.

24. MEDICATION CONTROL

Any animal attending Stoneleigh Horse Show may be subject to dope testing. Grandstand Media Limited reserve the right to share qualifier and HOYS entry information with the relevant showing society, and vice versa, for the purpose of HOYS matters to include, but not limited to, qualification or disciplinary.

25. INCIVILITY

- I. Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any Judge, Steward or to any Show Official on the part of the competitor, groom, rider, owner, driver or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such Official, disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.**
- II. Incivility, at any stage, towards a Show Official is unacceptable and, at the complete discretion of the Show Organisers, may result in the offender being asked to leave the Show or made subject to sanctions including, but not limited to, a fine, suspension or exclusion from any part of the Show. In this connection, exhibitors and competitors are reminded of their responsibility for the actions of others.**

26. OBJECTIONS

Any objection or protest is to be lodged by obtaining a printed Objection Form from the Show Secretary at the Show which must be completed by and signed by the Objector and delivered to the Show Secretary accompanied by a deposit of **£100.00 in cash within 30 minutes** after the results have been announced in the arena, in respect of which the objection is lodged.

Grandstand Media Ltd. is unable to accept objections involving Joint Measurement Board (JMB) certificates. The objection shall be determined by the Appeals Committee who may require and receive such evidence as they think fit and in particular may require the Objector or the Competitor in respect of which such objection was lodged to make a statutory declaration upon any question of fact concerning the matter of such objection.

If the objection shall be determined against the Objector, he shall also be liable to the Show for the amount of costs and expenses occasioned by the objection and the determination thereof, unless in the opinion of the Organisers who determine the objection there existed good and reasonable grounds for the objection, when they may order to the contrary.

27. DISQUALIFICATION

In the event of any animal being disqualified whether as the result of any objection or otherwise, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that competition shall take the prize awarded to such disqualified animal. The result of the class will be reset as if the disqualified animal had not taken part in the competition.

28. RESPONSIBILITY

The organisers of Stoneleigh Horse Show have no liability to the competitor for any accident, injury, damage, illness, disease or other loss occurring to the competitor's property and/or animals and shall only have liability to the competitor for personal injury or death to the extent caused by or contributed to by their negligence.

The competitor shall be responsible to the Organising Team of Stoneleigh Horse Show, their principals and Grandstand Media Ltd for losses suffered by them to the extent that it arises from or is contributed to in any way by any act, neglect, or omission by the competitor or by any person for whom or of any animal for which the competitor is responsible.

Competitors must have in place adequate, sufficient third-party insurance cover for the participation at Stoneleigh Horse Show.

All children under the age of 14, must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times while on the showground. Each competitor will be considered responsible in all aspects for the attendants in charge of their

animals and for any other servants or agents of theirs for the consequences of any infringement by any such persons of these Rules and Regulations.

29. INSURANCES

All exhibitors, competitors, owners, riders, handlers, drivers and/or producers, at Stoneleigh Horse Show are personally responsible for damages to any building, land, equipment or otherwise on the Showground or other areas of the NAEC or to any third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. It is a requirement that they have in force third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in or at Stoneleigh Horse Show. Such insurance cover for third-party liability should be for no less than £2million.

30. DECISIONS

The decision of the Organisers (including their employees, representatives and show officials) the Veterinary Surgeons and any Judges upon any of the matters required by the foregoing Rules to be decided or directed by any such persons or bodies including any question of height or soundness or want of merit or exclusion from final judging or granting of any permission or otherwise shall be final and binding in all respects and no objection shall be made on account thereof nor shall any appeal lie there from on any ground whatsoever.

31. ORGANISERS POWERS

Subject hereinafter provided the organisers shall have power:

- I. To interpret these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions applicable to the competitions and to appoint Stewards and Officials for the enforcement thereof and for the purposes of the Show generally and such persons shall have full power accordingly.
- II. The right to make amendments to the Schedule, the General Rules and Regulations of Stoneleigh Horse Show or any of the Show's classes and their associated rules as necessary at any time and use reasonable endeavours to notify such changes to each entered competitor. Any such change will be displayed in the Equestrian Office and/or Stable Manager's office at the show.
- III. In addition to the provisions relating to Objections to determine any matter, question or difference whatever arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show or to these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions and the decisions of such Stewards and Officials shall be final and binding and no appeal shall lie there from, and shall also have power in case of emergency or expediency to suspend or relax any Rule or Regulation for such period and to such extent and in such manner as they think fit.

32. RULES

Provided always that when a competition is held under Rules, such Rules of an affiliated association or society as are appropriate to the type and class of competition shall apply and shall have effect throughout such competition until immediately after the announcement of the results thereof. For all Horse of the Year Show qualifying classes, should there be a conflict between such association or society rules and the 'General Rules and Regulations' of Horse of the Year Show as printed in the Showing Rules of Horse of the Year Show and in this schedule, the latter will prevail.

33. PLACARDS AND NOTICES

No placard or notice of any description shall be placed on any stall, vehicle or circulated in the Show without the signed permission of the Organisers.

34. PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO CAMERAS

The use of cameras and video cameras or such other photographic or filming equipment is strictly limited to personal use and may not be used for any commercial gain.

35. TELEVISION/ VIDEO/ FILMING/MARKETING

It is a condition of participation at Stoneleigh Horse Show that all participants agree to allow official photography and recording of themselves and their property during any part of the show. It is a further condition of participation that all participants allow all such photographed and recorded materials to be used, at the Organiser's discretion, for broadcasting, future promotion and/or publicity in respect of Stoneleigh Horse Show, its sponsors and partners.

36. HEALTH AND SAFETY

Competitors must adhere to any Health and Safety policies issued to them from time to time by the Organisers. These will be displayed in the Stable Manager's Office, in necessary location on the showground and the Show Office on the showground.

37. HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

The Organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety. The Show is organised in accordance with Health and Safety Legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the show are responsible for ensuring that:

- I) Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the Show.
- II) They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
- III) Access to and egress from the site is safe.
- IV) Members of the public and competitors are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety legislation.

37.1 Emergencies

- I) Emergency services must always have access to all parts of the show site and members of the public must not park vehicles to obstruct access.
- II) First Aid points are clearly marked.
- III) In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or steward.

37.2 Horses

Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas and to avoid behaviour that might alarm horses. Parents/guardians must always supervise children.

38. NOISE CURFEW

For residents living adjacent to the NAEC, the organisers in line with Warwick District Council orders are imposing a noise curfew on the showground (including the stable area and horsebox parking area) between the hours of 23.00 and 06.30 on each day. Accordingly, every competitor must use their best endeavours to ensure that noise generated in these areas is kept to an absolute minimum, so as not to cause a nuisance to neighbouring residents.

39. SUITABILITY OF RIDER

Equine welfare is of paramount importance and all riders must always be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden which includes horses/ponies being warmed up and/or exercised (anywhere at Stoneleigh Horse Show to include but not limited to exercise areas Collecting Rings or vehicle parks day or night). Stoneleigh Horse Show reserves the right to take further action against any exhibitor and/or professional producer who permits any person (including an exhibitor and/or professional producer) to ride a horse or pony

when the size and/or weight of the rider compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden. The issue of welfare will be determined by the on-site veterinary team and will include vets, stewards and officials having the authority to require the rider to dismount to enable a member of the onsite veterinary team to determine whether in the opinion of chief steward the rider is of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony. The decision of the chief steward shall be final.

ENTRY FEE AND PRIZE MONEY

Early Entry fee for HOYS classes is £55, HOYS entries made after the early closing date will increase to £65 – entries to be made online only at www.grandstandentries.com. Entry fee includes a £18 HOYS contribution.

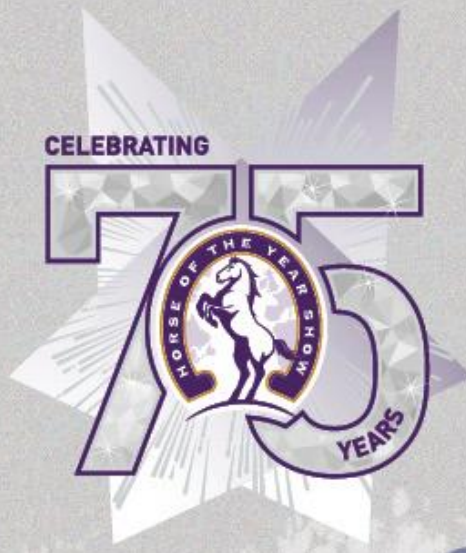

101. SPORT HORSE BREEDING OF GREAT BRITAIN WORKING HUNTER OF THE YEAR

JUDGES – EMMA POND (RIDE) & JOLI SMITH (CONFORMATION)

This competition is for Working Hunters, any weight, mares, geldings or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old or over, exceeding 148cm, to be ridden. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB. Horses must be registered with the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

Fences will not exceed 1.14m (3ft 9ins) in height, there should be a minimum of 8 fences and a maximum of 12 fences. The course must contain a combination and should contain a water tray. This class will be judged in two parts. Part One (Jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

Ponies must not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. This competition is for Small Hunters, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm and not exceeding 158cm, to be ridden. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB. You do not have to be a member of any Society to Compete in TSR Classes

Talent Spotting will take place in all classes

Training classes are aimed at those riders who wish to train in a show setting to gain experience without the pressure of a competitive class. This is intended to be a fun, confidence building session.

A trainer will run through the aspects of what is expected in a show class and offer help and advice.

Turnout – Riders must wear appropriate riding clothing but this does not have to be competition wear. Those who wish to wear competition clothing can do so. Animals do not have to be plaited but must be presented in appropriate tack and state in which to take part in this class. Boots are allowed. No training aids permitted.

Stallions must wear a bridle disc and/or also wear an appropriate tail ribbon. Riders must be suitably mounted.

Junior riders of Stallions not exceeding 138cm must be 12 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

Junior riders of Stallions exceeding 138cm must be 16 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

Rosette will be given to all those take part. No placings will be awarded.

You do not need to be a member of any society to take part in these training classes.

Mare or Gelding 4 years and over, any height or type. Riders any age, to be suitably mounted.

Class will do a group go round in walk and trot only, then line up and do a short freestyle show in walk and trot.

132. NOVICE RIDDEN HORSE/PONY ANY TYPE

Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over. Riders any age, to be suitably mounted. No galloping. Not ridden by the Judge.

133. RIDDEN VETERAN HORSE/PONY

Mixed age 15 years old and over. Rider any age, to be suitably mounted.

No Galloping

Junior riders of Stallions not exceeding 138cm must be 12 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

Junior riders of Stallions exceeding 138cm must be 16 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

134. OPEN RIDDEN HORSE- ANY TYPE

Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, exceeding 148cm. Riders any age, to be suitably mounted. Not ridden by the Judge.

Junior riders of Stallions exceeding 138cm must be 16 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

135. OPEN RIDDEN PONY – ANY TYPE

Stallion Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over. Ponies not Exc 148 cms. Riders Any Age

Junior riders of Stallions exceeding 138cm must be 16 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

Junior riders of Stallions not exceeding 138cm must be 12 years old & over on 1st January in the current year.

Overall Championship from Classes 124 - 135, 1st and 2nd Eligible.

137. WORKING HUNTER CLEAR ROUND

This is open to mares, geldings and stallions of all types, four years old or over. Entrants do not need to be registered with a society to enter.

This class is divided into three sections as follows:

137A	60cm Clear Round.
137B	80cm Clear Round.
137C	100cm Clear Round.

The Clear Round will be conducted over a Working Hunter Course, built by Jasean Spraggett.
